AS THE ABLELIGHT COLLEGE AND CONCORDIA STAFF & FACULTY PREPARE FOR THE 24-25 ACADEMIC YEAR, THE INQUIRY AND APPLICATION PROCESS IS UNDERWAY FOR THE 3RD YEAR FELLOWSHIP. THE 3RD YEAR FELLOWSHIP IS DESIGNED TO SUPPORT GRADUATES OF THE ABLELIGHT CERTIFICATE OF APPLIED LEARNING PROGRAM WHO WANT TO CONTINUE ACADEMIC, CAREER, AND INDEPENDENT LIVING INSTRUCTION TO PREPARE FOR EMPLOYMENT. APPLICANTS FOR THE FELLOWSHIP YEAR SHOULD SUBMIT AN INQUIRY/APPLICATION LETTER (EMAIL OR WORD DOCUMENT) OUTLINING WHY YOU FEEL YOU WOULD BE A GOOD CANDIDATE FOR THIS OPPORTUNITY, YOUR CAREER AND INDEPENDENT LIVING GOALS THAT WILL BE BOLSTERED BY THE FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM, AND SUMMARY OF YOUR PROGRESS AND ACHIEVEMENTS IN THE CERTIFICATE OF APPLIED LEARNING PROGRAM. APPLICATION LETTERS NEED TO BE SUBMITTED TO ALAN OTHMER, MANAGER OF EDUCATION & TRANSITION SERVICES, AT ALAN.OTHMER@ABLELIGHT.ORG ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 15, 2024. APPLICANTS WILL BE NOTIFIED IN WRITING OF THEIR STATUS FOR APPROVAL/DENIAL BY JANUARY 31, 2024.

APPLICATION REVIEW WILL INCLUDE ASSURANCE OF THE ALIGNMENT OF BOTH THE STUDENT WITH THE PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS, AS WELL AS THE OFFERINGS OF THE PROGRAM WITH THE STUDENTS CAREER GOALS (E.G. A CAREER GOAL OUTSIDE OF THE AREAS OF FOCUS OF CUWAA AND/OR ABLELIGHT). FOLLOWING ACCEPTANCE INTO THE PROGRAM, FELLOWSHIP STUDENTS WILL WORK WITH THEIR ABLELIGHT ADVISOR IN THE SPRING SEMESTER OF THEIR 2ND YEAR, TO IDENTIFY CAREER INTEREST AREAS, INDEPENDENT STUDY AREAS, AND ANY (OPTIONAL) CU ACADEMIC COURSES THAT WOULD SUPPLEMENT THE STUDENT'S PRACTICAL KNOWLEDGE OF THE VOCATIONAL AREA OF FOCUS. SYLLABI FOR THE FELLOWSHIP YEAR ARE THEN INDIVIDUALIZED TO THE STUDENT'S AREA OF FOCUS AND LEARNING PLAN. ALL 2ND YEAR STUDENTS ARE ENGAGED IN THE CREATION OF A TRANSITION TOOLKIT DURING THE SPRING SEMESTER, REGARDLESS OF ACCEPTANCE INTO THE 3RD YEAR FELLOWSHIP.

AN OVERVIEW OF THE FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM:

THE THIRD-YEAR FELLOWSHIP IS COMPRISED OF FIVE MAJOR ELEMENTS.

- 1. INTERNSHIP/VOCATIONAL EXPERIENCE(S) (BUILDING UPON THE EXPERIENCES FROM YEARS 1 & 2, A "NEXT LEVEL" EXPERIENCE IDEALLY IN THE COMMUNITY IS OFFERED)
 2. COMMUNITY APPLICATION COURSE (CAMPUS & COMMUNITY-BASED EXPERIENCES THAT ARE CONNECTED TO A PARTICULAR EVENT/ACTIVITY EMPHASIZING APPLICATION OF CRITICAL THINKING AND PROBLEM SOLVING SKILLS)
- 3. SOCIAL & COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT (ON AND OFF CAMPUS ACTIVITIES FOCUSED ON BUILDING INDEPENDENT RECREATION/LEISURE AND SOCIAL SKILLS)
- 4. SELECTED CUW AUDITED COURSES (OPTIONAL, BASED UPON AVAILABILITY AND APPLICABILITY, COURSES WILL BE CONNECTED TO CAREER DRIVEN FOCUS AREA)
 5. INDEPENDENT STUDY (A SPECIFIC AREA OF INTEREST/PASSION/SKILL BUILDING THAT IS JOINTLY DETERMINED WITH STUDENT AND ADVISOR)

CAPSTONE ASSIGNMENT:

THE CAPSTONE ASSIGNMENT CULMINATING THE FELLOWSHIP YEAR IS THE DEVELOPMENT AND PRESENTATION OF A PORTFOLIO INCLUDING EVIDENCE OF PROFICIENCY TOWARD EACH OF THE MAJOR 21ST CENTURY SKILLS
